

Maths

Your homework in maths will normally be based on something that you have been doing in class recently. It might be a worksheet or a puzzle or something on the computer. It's an important part of your learning so make sure to do your best!

English

All students will be required to read their Accelerated Reader for at least 30 minutes per week; it is an expectation that parents will sign the relevant page in their son/daughter's homework planner to confirm that the reading has been completed. In addition, all students will be given home learning from their SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) booklet in order to improve the students' knowledge of language and their writing skills.

History

Students complete a homework project per half term which links to the topics they study during lessons. The purpose of these projects is to enable students to consolidate and extend their subject knowledge as well as develop research skills. Students receive homework booklets at the beginning of a half term with each project requiring them to present their work in a variety of different formats.

Geography

This is set on a weekly basis by individual staff. It will vary between short tasks building on learning within the classroom and revision for regular tests on knowledge and understanding gained as each course progresses. This homework may also comprise of one extended home learning project set per term which allows for the consolidation and extension of knowledge and is assessed according to National Curriculum criteria.

D&T

DT pupils are given a menu style homework. It is expected they will complete a section or entire task every week of approximately 20 minutes.

Languages

All students receive one homework per week of varying kinds e.g. learning, written work, reading comprehension, listening comprehension, creative work or research work. In addition to the homework set, we strongly recommend our students to find the time to read through the learning points for each lesson and to revise vocabulary and grammar regularly.

Art

Students are to complete research and investigation that supports their classwork. This is either as a project, fact finding, gathering resources or practicing skills.

Computing

All Yr7-9 homelearning and class tasks can be accessed through your child's online learning details, which they are given on their first Computing lesson.

Music

A range of listening tasks; listening logs; research into film music and specific artists/bands; theory tasks; vocal exercises; comprehension sheets; completion of charts and grids.

RE

Each week students will be preparing an answer to a question which will be discussed at the start of the following lesson.

PE

PE home learning will be set twice during each half term with work linked to the PE assessment wheel as well as sporting activities being covered during lessons. Students are also encouraged to become involved in sporting activities outside of the classroom, whether in school extra-curricular clubs or outside of school.

Science

Home learning will be set according to the topic being studied at the time. In year 7, students should expect to receive a minimum of 3 pieces of homework per topic (each topic lasting 6 weeks). Students are also expected to review their work weekly and ensure that keywords and terms are learnt. At week 5 of each unit students are expected to revise using books and links on the VLE in preparation for their end of unit assessment.
